Rumors continue to swirl around the fate of St. Alban's Anglican Church on Ryan Street off of Belmont Avenue.

Years ago, the diminutive building, loaded with character and charm, was moved into place on Ryan Street from another location to temporarily serve the community. From baptisms to weddings and everything in between, St. Alban's has served well and stood tall among the Garry Oaks. However, a diocese-wide survey of

the congregation suggested that it might be time to move on. Changing demographics and declining financial viability of the church might be the deciding factors in a future closure.

Speculation aside, at press time no decision has been made. And we are assured by Anglican Church representatives that regardless of what happens, the church itself, along with the adjacent grounds and hall, will not be destroyed or sold at this time. So please, continue to enjoy your Sunday service and all the amenities you have come to enjoy as patrons of St. Alban's Hall.

HARNESS THE SUN AND SAVE!

Want to reduce your hydro bill by 60% and have one of the hottest rooftops in Oaklands?

Solar BC would like to help Oaklands run with the sun. Solar BC (a BC Sustainable Energy Association initiative) is offering subsidies up to \$1625.00 to help 2000 households harvest the sun to heat their water.

And it gets even better, because now, if a group of 20 or more home-owners place orders together, each household will receive an additional \$375.00, bringing the total rebate to \$2,000.00 per installation on existing rooftops.

AND among the first 100 households to register for a solar hot water system in 2009, two lucky winners will be reimbursed for 100% of their expenses.

AND the new federal home renovation tax credit also can be applied to solar installation.

AND for those of us without cash-on-hand (ha, ha), there are low-interest loans available through TD Bank or Van City for this endeavor.

Going solar has always been economical, since the long term financial and environmental savings are profound. But going solar has never been so affordable or just plain neighbourly as it is right now.

Oaklands, let's go! There will be an information meeting about solar-powered hot water technology and the current financial incentives, at the Community Association on Wednesday, April 29, at 7:00 pm. Come to the meeting even if you're only curious! If at least 20 of us are ready to leap to sun power, we'll contact Solar

BC to initiate the next step. They will guide us through the whole process, including finding reputable installers at the lowest current market price.

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PROGRESSIVE CHANGE MISSING IN THE FEDERAL BUDGET

Many of you have contacted me regarding the federal budget which was passed February 3 in the House of Commons. I would like to share with you the reasons why I feel this budget, despite a few encouraging initiatives, is a huge disappointment.

Under Mr. Harper's budget, not one additional unemployed person will become eligible for employment insurance and no new child-care spaces will be created. It does not provide meaningful funding for new affordable housing it takes no bold steps to respond to climate change. In fact, this budget takes Canada backwards on this front as it cancels the government's one successful eco-energy program that promoted clean energy.

The budget attacks pay equity for women, makes post-secondary education less accessible and cuts funding to Canada's research councils. It pits one province against another. The infrastructure plan contains unrealistic requirements for matching funds from cities and provinces.

Liberals and New Democrats had formed a plan to work together to protect the vulnerable, safeguard Canadian jobs and create a new sustainable economy. The Liber-

als changed their mind and decided to support the Conservatives' scattershot approach to the economic downturn. This was a missed opportunity.

I did extensive consultation in my riding and forwarded this input to Ottawa – but unfortunately it fell on deaf ears. When Mr. Flaherty was in Victoria he chose to meet behind closed doors only with those he wanted to hear from – the result is \$60 billion in corporate tax cuts and only \$1.5 billion for the unemployed and no new funding for seniors on fixed incomes.

Instead of using this economic downturn to prepare Canadians for the future through investment in a knowledge-based green economy, we have an attempt in this budget to placate a miscellany of interests without a vision or a national project that would leave Canada stronger in the future.

The Harper government is pledging \$12 billion for infrastructure projects over the next two years, but cities don't have money to embark on huge projects, so if federal spending is tied to municipal contributions many worthwhile projects won't go forward.

I am committed to being a watchdog for my riding, to monitor these promises and see just how much money actually flows from this government. Mr. Harper's track record does not inspire confidence. Broken Conservative commitments include \$250 million promised in 2007 for child-care spaces which have not materialized. The government also previously pledged to expand the Building Canada Fund but the

Federation of Canadian Municipalities has reported that almost none of the \$1.5 billion that should have flowed from the fund in 2007-09 has actually been allocated.

It is unfortunate that Canada missed its opportunity in this budget to demonstrate the kind of change that has incited so much hope south of the border. I will vote against this budget and continue to advocate in Ottawa for progressive change – for a forward-thinking knowledge and green economy, for supports for the growing number of Canadians who are losing their jobs, and for construction of rental and co-op housing.

It is my hope that we are not looking at another 40 votes on regressive legislation in the House of Commons where the Liberals prop up a government that does not believe in government's role to protect the public good and be an agent of change.

I invite you to keep me informed of the issues that are affecting you and your family so that I may continue to effectively represent your interests in Ottawa.

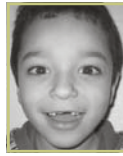

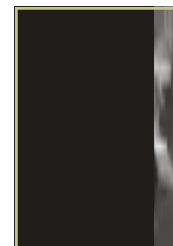

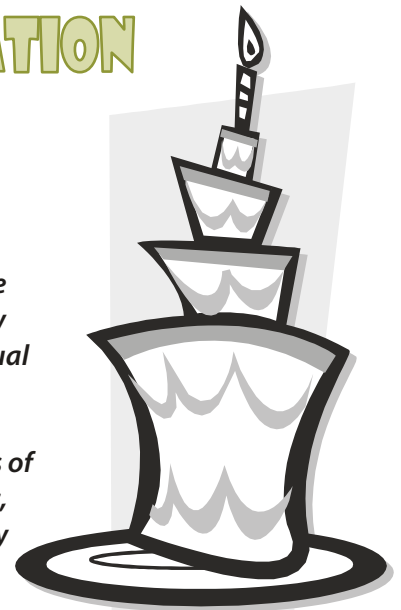
