Victor Street Water Main

The water main replacement project on Victor Street is progressing and will be complete by mid-February. The water pipe infrastructure replacement will wrap up within two weeks, then the curb and sidewalks will be constructed. This will be followed by the final phase, asphalt installation, in early February.

2017 Dog Licence

All dogs over the age of four months must be licensed in the City of Victoria. Collar licences are the fastest way to reunite you with your lost dog. They also help to offset the cost of providing dog waste bags in City parks and support the animal control and pound service that shelters, feeds and provides care for lost and injured animals.

If you purchase your licence before February 28, you will save \$20. You will also automatically be entered into a prize draw for the “#1” dog licence tag for 2017 and gift certificates to local businesses. Licence fee rates are:

- Neutered or Spayed Dog – \$30 (\$50 after February 28)
- Unaltered Dog – \$40 (\$60 after February 28)

Residential Parking... Just So You Know

Marked residential parking zones ensure parking for residents is protected where there is demand from other users for on-street spaces. Only residents, their visitors and contractors working at the residence can park in these zones. Guests who will be parking for over seven days can register their vehicle with Parking Services (250.261.0260) to park in these zones. Tickets are issued when a complaint is received by a resident and where the vehicle is not registered. If a ticket is issued to a guest or contractor prior to them registering, email parkingservices@victoria.ca with the ticket number and proof of your address to have the ticket cancelled.
